

# LESSONS LEARNED AND WAY FORWARD



The evaluation of the Sixth Country Programme (2017-2022) for UNFPA Iran found the programme to be relevant, efficient and effective. The evaluation also called for a greater focus on quality of care, a more structured data systems informed by significant attention to people living in vulnerable situations, strategic use of emerging demographic dynamics as the driving force for development; adoption of a holistic life-cycle approach in programming; and a more efficient and effective humanitarian response.



Challenges faced by UNFPA Iran in the Sixth Country Programme (2017-2022) included navigating natural disasters and responding to emerging crises such as the COVID-19 pandemic. In spite of challenges encountered, UNFPA was considered a credible partner by key stakeholders and United Nations organizations, with the ability to adapt flexibly to specific contexts.



UNFPA will further invest in supporting the government of Iran towards implementation of action plans and strategies jointly developed for building resilience and empowering youth, women, and older people, through innovation, creativity and partnership. This will be done with the spirit of delivering as One UN in close partnership with our UN sister agencies under the United Nations Sustainable Development Cooperation Framework (UNSDCF) with the Government of the Islamic Republic of Iran.

#### LESSONS LEARNED AND FUTURE PLANS



As a result of sustained advocacy efforts, UNFPA succeeded in reviving its partnership on midwifery with the Ministry of Health and Medical Education, international organizations and other UN agencies. The pivotal role of midwives will continue to be reinforced in the next programme cycle, to promote positive childbearing experiences and natural childbirth. Interventions will be targeted to women and mothers in vulnerable situations for their equitable access to quality maternal health services. Research and in-depth data analysis will remain central for evidence based interventions.



UNFPA is the UN Sexual and Reproductive Health (SRH) agency. During the Sixth Country Programme (2017-2022), UNFPA Iran and partners collaborated to empower women and girls in vulnerable situations. This has been achieved through various programmes and initiatives aimed at improving the sexual and reproductive health of women and girls, and empowering them by enhancing their employability.

# **CAPACITY DEVELOPMENT**



**400** female heads of households, including women with disability, provided with employment during COVID-19 in Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) production units



**494** households in a village in Qazvin province covered by community-based program to protect women and girls affected by disaster. This included the formation of local village groups, development of guidelines, and training on prevention and response to domestic violence among community members



**1,428** teachers and students from selected universities trained on risky behaviors for the prevention of HIV/AIDS, through attending a series of 38 workshops on the topic



**883** women and youth trained on life skills and vocational skills, jointly with UNDP, and with the support of the European Union (EU)



**40** women counseling centers across the country trained on harm reduction to provide services to women at most risk of drug use, through various workshops



**10,500** SRH commodities and **1,240** doses of HPV vaccines delivered to the Ministry of Health and Medical Education to cover the needs of women at risk of HIV



Single Window of Social Support developed, as an integrated social service delivery platform for social protection programmes offered to Female Heads of Households



**21** women counseling centers were equipped and continued their operation through provision of salaries for 13 midwives and psychologists in 6 provinces to provide SRH and mental health services to the most at risk populations



**91** health experts in the Ministry of Health and Medical Education trained on prevention of burnout, and 750 experts trained on HIV prevention innovative approaches, from the State Welfare Organization, Prison Organization, Ministry of Sciences, Medical Universities, and Iranian Red Crescent Society and others

### LESSONS LEARNED AND FUTURE PLANS



UNFPA Iran will continue to support the government in implementing national plans to empower Female Heads of Households through targeted training on life, entrepreneurial, and vocational skills. UNFPA Iran will also work towards developing the capacity of service providers to promote healthy family relationships and provide health and well-being services to women and girls in low-income households. It will generate evidence to scale up the provision of social welfare services for poor women living in vulnerable situations, including older women and women with disabilities.



UNFPA is the UN Sexual and Reproductive Health (SRH) agency. Using a lifecycle approach - where investment in SRH starting from childhood to youth and middle-age will secure healthy ageing- UNFPA supported its partners during the Sixth Country Programme (2017-2022), to address the needs of older persons.



#### LESSONS LEARNED AND FUTURE PLANS



UNFPA will continue its long standing partnership with the Government of the Islamic Republic of Iran to intensify its outreach to older persons, especially older women and people with disabilities. This will be done through continued generation of evidence, capacity building including establishment of ageing information and management systems, continued advocacy for age-friendly and disability-friendly environments, promotion of active and healthy ageing, and analysis of various social protection programmes and social security schemes to cover the needs of older persons.




# LESSONS LEARNED AND FUTURE PLANS

# **CAPACITY DEVELOPMENT**



21 centers equipped for the provision of Mental Health and Psychosocial Support Services country wide



21 staff of local and international NGOs trained on protection of women and girls in emergencies



**156** community volunteers trained on protection of women and girls in emergencies



**50** Afghan students trained as midwives with Bachelor and Master's degrees



Partnership with private diagnostic laboratories to improve access to reproductive healthcare related primarily diagnostic services, amongst vulnerable Afghan women, across the country



Faculty strategic plan and curriculum developed for the Midwifery Department of Kabul Medical University, through a south-south partnership by carrying out needs assessment and consensus-building workshops in site using Iranian expertise
